What is EMPATHS?

Putting people at the heart of heritage

EMPATHS (EMpowering landscapes with Participatory Approaches to Heritage interpretation Skills) is a 30-month Erasmus+ project (Oct 2024 – Mar 2027), coordinated by *Interpret Europe*. Its aim is simple but powerful: to transform how we interpret heritage by involving communities directly in the process.

Too often, heritage professionals lack the tools to facilitate effective participatory heritage interpretation. EMPATHS tackles this by developing a new blended training programme that helps professionals co-create heritage stories with local communities — making them active participants, not just spectators.

The training will be tested through pilot projects in Austria, Italy and Greece and offered to VET providers as a replicable model.

The ultimate goal? Stronger connections between people and places, and greater citizen participation in making decision about cultural and natural heritage.

Digital Innovation Meets Participatory Heritage

How can digital tools help communities reclaim and celebrate their heritage?

This was the focus of a recent LDNet webinar, where Alexander Colvine (Interpret Europe) and Giuseppe Pace (PAFLEG) presented insights from EMPATHS alongside European case studies—from a historic dockyard in Malta to a Greek marble quarry and an Italian factory town.

The event highlighted how local communities are using digital storytelling and concepts like memory twins to lead heritage interpretation processes.

Key message: Participation empowers people to shape their heritage, fostering creativity, identity, and long-term impact.
